Household Production and the Reproduction of Capitalist Society: Marxist Feminism Beyond Women

This book makes the case that Marxist Feminist understandings of the dynamics of household production in capitalist society must go beyond notions of "women" and "housewives" to adequately grasp the contradictions between human needs and the imperatives of accumulation. I argue that an emphasis on women and wives has impeded advancements in our understanding of household production by basing Marxist Feminist theory on a biological fiction and a household structure that is largely a fantasy for the working class.
